Subject: Fireworks Ban


Pursuant to Section 13-1-2 (D) of the City of Westminster's Municipal Code, the following Rules and Regulations are hereby established and deemed necessary for the orderly use and management of the City's park and recreation facilities and programs.

It shall be unlawful for any person to ignite any fireworks in any park or building without the written consent of the Director of Parks, Recreation and Libraries.

"Fireworks" shall mean any combustible or explosive composition, article, device, substance or combination of substances, prepared for the primary purpose of producing a visual or auditory sensation by combustion, explosion, deflagration or detonation including, without limitation, the following articles and devices commonly known and used as fireworks: toy cannons, toy cones, toy pistols or toy guns in which explosives are used (unless excepted below), blank cartridges, firecrackers, torpedoes, skyrockets, Roman candles, sparklers, or other devices of like construction, and any devices containing any explosive or flammable compound, or any tablets, or device containing any explosive substances.

"Fireworks" do not include auto flares or other emergency signal devices, or paper caps containing an average of 0.25 grain or less of explosive content per cap, or toy pistols, toy canes, toy guns or other devices for use of such caps.
