Subject: Westminster Promenade Rules and Regulations

Pursuant to Section 13-1-2 (D) of the Westminster Municipal Code, the following Rules and Regulations are hereby established and deemed necessary for the orderly use and management of the publicly-owned or maintained areas of the Westminster Promenade.


The following are prohibited:

1. Rollerblading, roller skating, skateboarding, etc.
2. Bicycle riding
3. Dogs or other pets
4. Swimming or wading in the Westminster Promenade Lake
5. Operation of any vessel on the Westminster Promenade Lake (full size or model) unless previously authorized by the Director of Parks, Recreation and Libraries
6. Skating on the Westminster Promenade Lake
7. Climbing on rock walls surrounding the Westminster Promenade Lake
8. Climbing in or around shrubs and flowerbeds
9. Parking or riding any motorized vehicle on public walkways
10. Playing any throwing activity, such as baseball, Frisbee, football, hockey, etc.
11. Locking or standing bikes, scooters or other non-powered vehicles to any benches, poles or other site fixtures
12. Minors 17 years of age or younger loitering on Westminster Promenade property. Loitering shall mean to be dilatory, to stand idly around, to linger, delay or wander about, or to remain idle in or about the Westminster Promenade property, whether in or out of a vehicle.
13. Littering the area with trash, food waste, or chewing gum

14. Minors 17 years of age or younger remaining on Westminster Promenade property during curfew hours which are from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. except as provided below:
- a. When accompanied by a parent or guardian, a person between eighteen and twenty-one years of age with written parental authorization, or a person twenty-one years of age or older with parental authorization.
 - b. For one-half hour before or after employment hours when commuting directly to and from such employment and when carrying an employer's certification of time and place of employment. When going to or returning directly home from events such as movies, theatre or sporting events.
 - c. When conducting a reasonably necessary errand directed by the parent or guardian.
 - d. When in a motor vehicle involved in interstate travel.
 - e. When exercising First Amendment rights under the United States Constitution, such as the free exercise of religion, speech, and assembly.
 - f. When involved in an emergency, which involves the protection of a person or property from an imminent threat of serious bodily injury or substantial damage.

Any defiance of these rules and regulations or any other in Title 13 of the City Code may result in criminal prosecution and/or an order prohibiting the offender from being in or upon the publicly-owned or maintained areas of the Westminster Promenade.
